Judy lived her faith in a down to earth and human style. Her Catholic faith inspired her and prompted her to view live through the Gospel values of Jesus. She loved her place in the 5<sup>th</sup> Ward and befriended the poor, the hungry, the addicted and those on the edge of society. She had a unique ability of reaching out to the down trodden, befriending them and helping them out. It's easy to picture the conversation between Judy and Jesus when they met on May 30<sup>th</sup>. . . . "Judy, well done, good and faithful servant. What you did for the least, you did for me. Come, enter the joy of your Heavenly Father!" With that infectious smile she had, she probably said back to Jesus. . . "Thank you Jesus for the welcome. ## Deacon's Corner

This week, as a Church community, we celebrate the solemnity of St. Peter and St. Paul on Wednesday, June 29. Together, these two saints were the founders of the Holy See in Rome through their ministry, preaching, and martyrdom. St. Peter, also called Cephas, "the Rock," was martyred in Rome in 64 A.D. St. Paul, the "Apostles of the Gentiles," was taken to Rome, imprisoned, and beheaded in 67 A.D.

The day after this solemnity, on Thursday, June 30, the optional memorial for First Martyrs of Holy Roman Church is observed. In 64 A.D., the Roman emperor, blamed the fire that destroyed one half of Rome on the Christians who resided in the city. These holy women and men, known as the "Protomartyrs of Rome," were the first martyrs that were persecuted and executed in mass numbers. These martyrs died before St. Peter and St. Paul. Many were crucified, burned to death, and fed to wild animals.

The faith of these martyrs provided firm testimony to others which lead to their conversion in the early church. The site of St. Peter's martyrdom and the other martyrs is marked by the Piazza dei Protomartiri Romani in the Vatican next to St. Peter's Basilica.

This week pray, "Like these holy women and men, may we ask the Holy Spirit to help us to be firm and faithful in our love of Our Lord."
