



Deacon's Corner St. Anthony of Padua

The memorial for St. Anthony of Padua, Priest and Doctor of the Church, will be celebrated on Monday, June 13. He was born in Portugal in 1195 and entered the Augustinian monastery when he was fifteen. With the news of the Franciscan martyrs in Morocco, he joined the Franciscan order. At his request, he became a missionary in Morocco. After becoming ill, he went to Italy where he was assigned to the Franciscan province of Romagna.

St. Anthony had a devoted love of the Holy Eucharist and for the poor. He became a preacher by accident when the priest assigned to deliver the homily did not show up for a liturgy. St. Anthony's eloquence in preaching the Word of God was evident and was assigned to preach throughout northern Italy and France. Called the "Hammer of Heretics," he was very successful in converting heretics. St. Francis of Assisi appointed him a teacher of theology because of his learning and study.

At the age of 36, St. Anthony passed on to eternal life in 1231 and was canonized a year after his death. In 1946, Pope Pius XII declared St. Anthony a Doctor of the Church. He is the patron saint of the poor, lost items, and many other causes. May we ask St. Anthony to pray for us.
