SUNDAY EVENING MASS TO BEGIN AT OUR LADY OF HOPE CHURCH, COAL TOWNSHIP



Deacon's Corner

During this Christmas season, the memorial of St. John Neumann, Bishop will be celebrated on Thursday, January 5. St. John was born and lived in Bohemia,

which is now the Czech Republic. He wanted to be a missionary priest in the United States. With one suit and one dollar, he arrived in New York City in 1836. Shortly after his arrival, he was ordained a priest by the bishop of New York.

Initially, Father John Neumann's work focused on ministering to the people in Buffalo, NY. Later, he desired community life and joined the Order of the Redemptorists and was the first to make his vows to this Order in the United States. St. John became the superior of this order who dedicated their service to the poor and abandoned. He continued his priestly missionary work in Maryland, Virginia, and Ohio.

At the age of 41, St. John became the bishop of Philadelphia. In this diocese, he established 100 parochial schools to support the educational needs of the children. He also attracted teaching communities of sisters and Christian brothers to help with these efforts.

Bishop John Neumann visited our area when he traveled to Trevorton on May 20, 1860 to dedicate our sister parish's church, St. Patrick's and placed it under the patronage of this saint.

St. John was canonized in 1977. He is the patron saint of immigrants and sick children. May we ask St. John Neumann to pray for us.
