In Case You're Interested. . . One of our friars, Fr. Joe Angelini, Chaplain and Executive Director of the St. Kateri Tekakwitha National Shrine (Fonda, NY), shared the following recommended book titles for consideration as summer reading. Fr. Joe's comments are in quotes.

- 1. Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic by *Matthew Kelly*. "I decided to take the book seriously when I read that only 7% of Catholics are doing almost everything in their faith community and paying the maintenance and mission (p.12). Only 7% bothers me." 2. Reclaiming Vatican II by *Fr. Blake Britton*. "He investigates the polarization in the Church, especially with the liturgy, and the influences of the pervasive secularization. The book helps bring current issues into an acceptable conversation."
- 3. **Strangegods** by *Elizabeth Scalia* "Gives some wonderful insights into the Ten Commandments by showing how the other nine can be summed up in the first: "You shall have no other gods before me." She argues that our own idol-making far outstrips that of the ancient world. A fascinating perspective on an important spiritual problem."
- 4. Following Christ in a Consumer Society by Fr. John Kavanaugh "Gives many insights, but be careful of the elevated style of English. I recommend Chapter 1, "Reading the Life of the Consumer Society," and Chapter 8, "Reading the Life of Christ." Happy reading folks! Fr. Martin

Deacon's Corner – St. John Vianney

On Thursday, August 4, we celebrate the memorial of St. John Vianney, Priest. In 1805, at the age of 19, he entered the seminary to become a priest. After ordination, St. John was assigned to a small poor parish of 50 families in Ars, France. The people in this village were lax in their faith and caused trouble for Father John hoping that he would give up and leave. Rather, he persisted in his ministry praying and doing penance.

Eventually, by listening to his homilies and seeing his charitable acts, the people accepted St. John. After a few years, Father Vianney would spend 10 to 15 hours a day hearing the confessions of people. People throughout France and other countries came to him for confession and counsel. In fact, the government of France built a railroad to this tiny village to handle the volume of travelers.

Father Vianney had a devotion to helping the poor in the region. He sold all of his possessions and belonging to buy food and clothing for those in need. Father John was canonized in 1925 by Pope
