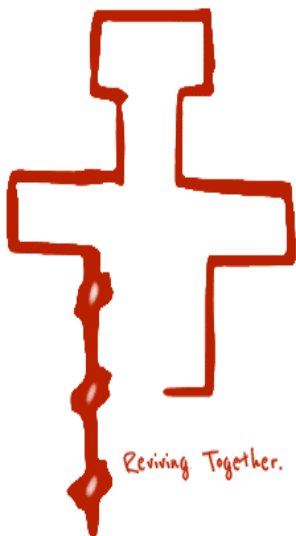

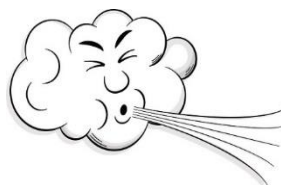

Deacon's Corner

The feast of Our Lady of Lourdes will be celebrated on Friday, February 11. Between February 11 and July 16, 1858, the Blessed

Mother appeared to Bernadette Soubirous 18 times in a small village at the foothills of the Pyrenes Mountains in southern France. She introduced herself to Bernadette, "I am the Immaculate Conception."

Bernadette described the apparition of the Blessed Mother as "a pretty young girl with a rosary over her arm." She wore a white robe with a white veil and there was a yellow rose on each foot. In 1862, the Church confirmed the appearance of Our Lady of Lourdes. Through this appearance to a humble person, the Blessed Mother energized the faith of millions of people throughout the world. The Blessed Virgin came to call sinners to her Son, Jesus. Her message was a request for prayer and penance.

On February 24, the Blessed Mother instructed Bernadette to dig into the ground near the grotto from which a spring of water flowed. To this day, this spring continues to flow producing over 32,000 gallons of water daily. The grotto at Lourdes has become a pilgrimage site of faith and healing visited by over 2 million people every year. A Basilica at Lourdes was consecrated at the site in 1876.
