

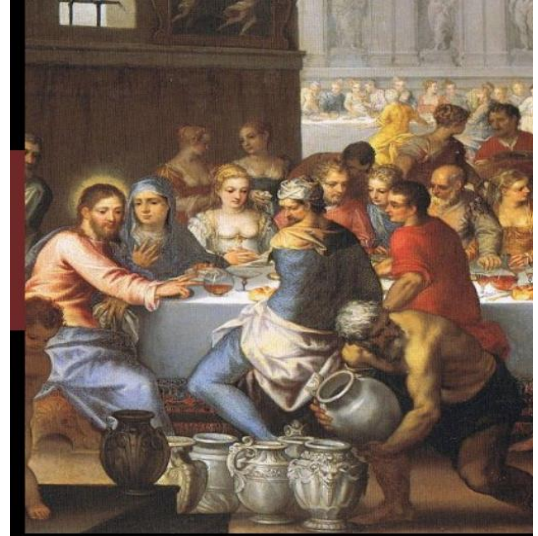

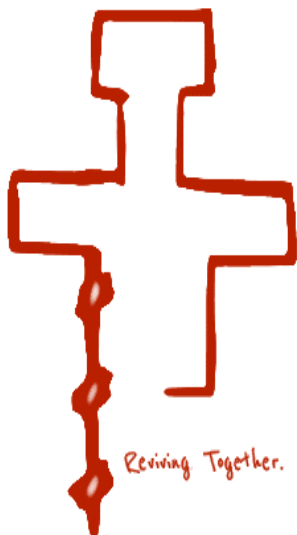

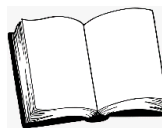

# Deacon's Corner

The feast day of Our Lady of Hope will be celebrated on Monday, January 17. This feast day commemorates the apparition of Our Lady on January 17, 1871 in

the town of Pontmain, France. That night, the Blessed Mother appeared in the night sky to two brothers, Eugene and Joseph Barbedette. Two other little girls from the village, Francoise Richer and Jeanne Marie LeBosse, also saw her in the sky. The other members of their family and adults from the town were not able to see Our Lady.

The people, who had gathered, began to pray the Rosary. As they prayed, the children reported that the image began to change as a blue oval frame with four candles appeared around Our Lady and her dress was covered with stars. The parish priest, Father Michel Guerin with the crowd of people, continued to pray the Magnificat and the Litany of Our Lady. Then, words appeared beneath the vision in the sky: "God will soon answer your prayer. My Son allows Himself to be moved."

The Church investigated and approved this apparition of Our Lady of Hope. A basilica was built in her honor in 1900 in the town, which was entrusted to the Oblates of Mary Immaculate. When the Oblates came to the United States, they constructed a shrine for Our Lady of Hope in Lake Champlain, New York. There is also a beautiful Chapel of Our Lady of Hope at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C.

## **John 2:1-11**

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from—although the servers who had drawn the water knew—the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

## Profession of Faith

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven,

and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
