This year we are pleased to welcome **Fr. Paul Prabell** who will be preaching at all the Masses this weekend, June 4 & 5 on behalf of the Diocese of Lexington Kentucky. He is a priest of that diocese and recently celebrated his 50th Anniversary of Priesthood Ordination.

The Lexington Diocese is relatively young, being established in 1988 by St. John Paul II. Catholics comprise approximately 3% of the overall population. The diocese is about the size of Maryland, Delaware and Rhode Island combined and is in the heart of Appalachia.

It serves the rolling hills of the urban and suburban areas of Central Kentucky as well as the mountainous and rural areas of Eastern Kentucky. Because of the severe poverty of the area, the majority of Catholic parishes depend on some kind of external funding to meet daily expenses.

Please be as generous as you can with your Mission Co-Op Mission envelope this weekend, June 4 & 5 and give a warm welcome to Fr. Prabell.

Deacon's Corner Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church

On Monday, June 6, at daily mass, we celebrate the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church. In 1964, Pope Paul VI "declared the Blessed Virgin Mary as Mother of the Church, that is to say of all Christian people, the faithful as well as the pastors, who call her the most loving Mother." Pope Francis instituted this memorial into the Church calendar and it is celebrated the Monday after Pentecost.

In the Gospel for this day, from His Holy Cross, Jesus entrusts His mother to the beloved disciple John and John to His mother. Through this Scripture passage, St. Pope John Paul II taught us that "Mary is present in the Church as the Mother of Christ, and at the same time as that Mother whom Christ, in the mystery of the Redemption, gave to humanity in the person of the Apostle John." (John 19:25-34)

On this special memorial, may we ask Our Blessed Mother to continue to pray for each of us and for our Holy Church, "Mother of the Church, enlighten us, the disciples of Your Son in faith, hope and charity as we love Our Lord and our sisters and brothers in this world."
