



9/11 Memorial to Visit Mother Cabrini

The 9/11 Memorial which was recently donated to the City of Shamokin will be on display at all the Masses at Mother Cabrini, the weekend of October 9 & 10. The monument is a piece of steel salvaged from the New York City Twin Towers. The brothers and sisters of +Stephen Siller, a NYC firefighter who perished in the tower collapse, formed the Stephen Siller Foundation, honoring their brother's sacrifice. The foundation honors +Stephen's memory by distributing these memorials as well as building custom fitted homes throughout the country for veterans who have been catastrophically injured in the line of duty. To date, 280 such homes have been built for our veterans. The foundation also assists Gold Star Widows and First Responders with housing needs. Mr. Craig Rhoades, former Shamokin Fire Chief, City Council Member and Director of Public Safety, will speak briefly at all our October 9/10 Masses explaining the monument's background as well as the good works of the Siller Foundation. Craig current serves as Project Manager for homes built through the auspices of the Stephen Siller Foundation.

Deacon's Corner

The Memorial for Saint Teresa of Jesus, also known as Saint Teresa of Avila, will be celebrated on Friday, October 15. Saint Teresa was born in Avila, Spain in 1515. At an early age, she entered the Carmelite Monastery. She devoted her entire life in reforming herself and the Carmelites. St. Teresa established a new Carmelite community known as the Discalced (shoeless) Carmelites who practice lives of prayer and simplicity. She founded 17 convents and wrote four books on prayer and contemplation.

Prayer was a central part of St. Teresa's life. She described prayer as "nothing else than an intimate sharing between friends; it means taking [time](#) frequently to be alone with Him who we know loves us. The important thing is not to think much but to love much and so do that which best stirs you to love. Love is not great delight but desire to please [God](#) in everything." Pope Francis explains, "The life of St. Teresa teaches us that the path of prayer is open to all who humbly open themselves to the action of the Spirit in their lives."

In 1622, St. Teresa was canonized and in 1970, she was named a Doctor of the Church for her writing and teaching on prayer. She and St. Catherine of Siena are the two women honored as Doctors of the Church. St. Teresa is the patron saint of headache sufferers. On her feast day, let us pray *The Prayer of St. Teresa*: "Let nothing disturb you; Let nothing frighten you. All things are passing. God never changes. Patience obtains all things. Nothing is wanting to them, who possesses God. God alone suffices."
