

Deacon's Corner

The memorial for St. Lucia (Lucy), Virgin and Martyr, will be celebrated on Monday, December 13. St. Lucia is the patron saint of

eye disorders and the blind. In Latin, the word, "Lucy," means light. All that is known for certain about St. Lucia is that she was a martyr for the faith in Syracuse, Italy during the persecutions of the fourth century. She consecrated her life to God and to the poor.

After her death, different legends have spread about St. Lucia. One legend is that the governor of Syracuse ordered her to burn a sacrifice to the emperor's image. When she refused, St. Lucy was tortured, blinded, and killed. When her body was prepared for burial, it was discovered that her eyes had been miraculously restored.

Let us ask St. Lucia to pray for us, "O St. Lucy, preserve the light of my eyes so that I may see the beauties of creation, the glow of the sun, the color of the flowers and the smile of children. Preserve also the eyes of my soul, the faith, through which I can know my God, understand His teachings, recognize His love for me and never miss the road that leads me to the company of the angels and saints in God's heavenly kingdom."
