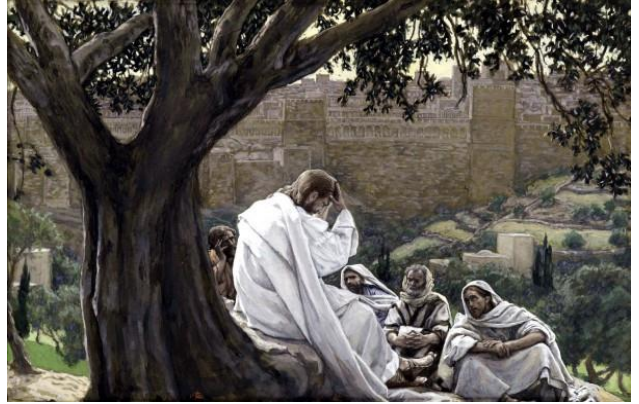

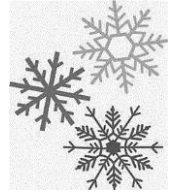


**2023 MASS BOOK

Deacon's Corner

A saint that we might not be familiar with is St. Rose Philippine Duchesne. The Church in the United States (U.S.) celebrates her optional memorial on Friday, November 18. Born in France in 1796, St. Rose became a sister in the [Society](#) of the Sacred Heart. She was sent to the U.S. and found a boarding school for the daughters of pioneers near St. Charles, Missouri. This school was the first free school for girls west of the Mississippi River.

Throughout her life, St. Rose had a deep desire to serve the Native American population in the West. She established a school at Sugar Creek, Kansas for the Potawatomi tribe who had been displaced from their ancestral lands. The children of this school called her "the [woman](#) who is always praying."

During her ministry on the frontier, she confronted many challenges including poor living conditions and the shortage of food and water. She had difficulty in learning the English language. Yet, with God's help, she persisted in the serving the needs of those who were in need. St. Pope John Paul II canonized her in 1988.

May we ask Saint Rose to pray for us, "St. Rose, you courageously persevered in your vocation despite the serious challenges in your life. With the Holy Spirit's help, may we persist in our lives as Christ's disciples loving Our Lord and helping one another in charity and kindness.
