## Preparation

Registration for the Religious Education and Sacrament Programs was held on Sunday, August 7, 2022. If you were not able to attend the registration, please stop at Our Lady of Hope Parish Office Monday or Tuesday from 9:00 AM – 3:00 PM or Wednesday from 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM to register. The fee for registration is \$30.00/child.

First Penance/Communion and Confirmation Candidates can also register at the above times.

Any child that will be in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and has completed 1 year of Religious Education or attended 1<sup>st</sup> grade at Lourdes, will be eligible to register. Confirmation candidates in grade 6th and also 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> grade students that were not registered last year are required to register. Students must complete 3 years of Confirmation Preparation in order to receive the Sacrament. There is a registration fee of \$30.00 for new registrations to cover books, supplies etc.

# OUR NEW PASTOR, FR. JIM FUKES, OFM CONV. SHARES THE FOLLOWING WITH US . . .

I was born in Utica, NY in 1961 and grew up as the middle child of nine children. At age 12, our family moved closer to Syracuse, then to Bridgeport, NY, where we lived right between two Franciscan parishes. It is there that the friars passed on their Franciscan spirituality to me.

Our family attended Saint Mary of the Assumption Church, Minoa, and St. Mary's elementary School.

For two years after high school, I worked a couple of jobs before studying two years for electronics at a local community college. I then worked at General Electric for four years before entering Franciscan formation in 1987.

# **Deacon's Corner**

The memorial of Saint Pius of Pietrelcina, Priest, better known as Padre Pio, will be celebrated on Friday, September 23. Saint Pius was known for his piety, charity, and the gift of the Stigmata. Born Francesco Forgione to a devout Catholic family in 1887, his parents were poor farmers in Italy. Francesco spent his early years tending his family small flock of sheep.

At age 15, Francesco entered the novitiate of the Capuchin Franciscan Friars. He took the name of "Pio" in honor of Pope Pius I. Padre Pio became a priest in 1910. The celebration of the Mass was at the center of his spirituality. In 1918, after celebrating Mass, while saying a prayer of thanksgiving before the Holy Cross, he received the Stigmata, the wounds of Christ, which appeared on his hands and feet.

After receiving the Stigmata, Padre Pio rarely left the friary. However, each morning after Mass, he heard confessions and blessed the sick. This ministry lasted 10 hours every day because of the crowds coming to him. St. Pius had a love for the sick and the suffering. Through his support, a hospital of 350 beds was built in San Giovanni Rotondo.

Padre Pio was canonized a saint in 2002. He is the patron saint of adolescents, stress relief, and civil service volunteers. Saint Padro Pio encouraged us, "Pray, hope, and don't worry. Worry is useless. God is merciful and will hear your prayer."
