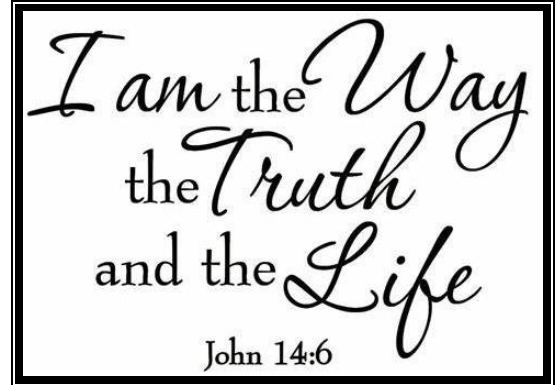

2022 Food Sale & Prizes Galore \$\$ Report!

We are confident that all the major bills and donations have come in for our recent July major fund raising events. I am happy to report the good news. The numbers are as follows:

All related and combined expenses for the two 2022 events were: **\$9,411.61**. This includes: all food supplies, utilities costs, kitchen materials, outdoor tent rental, raffle expenses, postage, printed materials, advertising, miscellaneous etc.

All related incomes for the two 2022 events were: **\$38,762.36**. This includes: donations, Parish Food Festival collection, food sales, pre-sale pierogi, Summertime Fun Raffle and Prizes Galore.

The **NET** for our two Summer Fund Raiser Events was **\$29,350.75!** This was \$8,267.87 more than last year's combined event. (2021 Net profit \$21,082.88)

A special note of thanks to all those parishioners (and non-parishioners) who came together so willingly to make these two events so successful. Combined, it was a perfectly harmonious symphony of volunteers! Thanks also to all those who contributed baskets, scratch tickets and monetary gifts and/or patronized our food sale and Baskets Galore! *Kudos, Thanks and Applause* to all involved!

Religious Education & Sacrament Preparation

Registration for the Religious Education and Sacrament Programs was held on Sunday, August 7, 2022. If you were not able to attend the registration, please stop at Our Lady of Hope Parish Office Monday or Tuesday from 9:00 AM – 3:00 PM or Wednesday from 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM to register. The fee for registration is \$30.00/child.

First Penance/Communion and Confirmation Candidates can also register at the above times.

Any child that will be in 2nd grade and has completed 1 year of Religious Education or attended 1st grade at Lourdes, will be eligible to register. Confirmation candidates in grade 6th and also 7th or 8th grade students that were not registered last year are required to register. Students must complete 3 years of Confirmation Preparation in order to receive the Sacrament. There is a registration fee of \$30.00 for new registrations to cover books, supplies etc.

DEACON'S CORNER. . . St. Bartholomew

We celebrate the feast of St. Bartholomew, Apostle, on Wednesday, August 24. Catholic tradition identifies Nathaniel in St. John's Gospel as St. Bartholomew, one of 12 Apostles. In this Gospel passage, St. Philip, an Apostle and friend of Nathaniel, brings him to see Jesus. As St. Bartholomew approaches, Jesus says to him, "Here is a true child of Israel. There is no duplicity in him." Immediately, in his own words, Nathaniel recognizes Jesus as "the Son of God . . . the King of Israel." (John 1:45-49)

How could St. Bartholomew make such a profound proclamation about Jesus as the Son of God in just meeting Him? He was a doctor in Jewish law, continually searching for the One as he prayed and studied Scripture and the Law. His heart and mind were open to the Lord. With the help of the Holy Spirit, St. Bartholomew's heart was deeply moved as he meets Jesus. He responds to Christ in true faith as "the one about whom Moses wrote in the law and also the prophets." He recognizes Jesus as the Messiah.

After the descent of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, legend tells us that St. Bartholomew preached the Good News of the Gospel to the people in India, Ethiopia, and Persia. Like St. Bartholomew, may we ask the Holy Spirit to open our hearts to Jesus in our daily lives.
