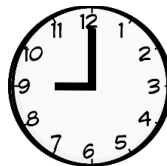

A Solemn Novena for St. Jude Thaddeus,

an Apostle and Patron Saint of Hopeless Causes, will be held at Our Lady of Hope Church, First and Chestnut Street, Coal Township beginning on Wednesday, October 19 to Thursday, October 27 (9 consecutive days). The novena will begin at 6:30 p.m. with prayers, a brief reflection, and veneration of the Saint Jude relic. Please join us for this novena. All are welcome.

Deacon's Corner

The feast of St. Luke, the Evangelist, will be celebrated on Tuesday, October 18. St. Luke is believed to be the author of the third Gospel as well as the Acts of the Apostles. St. Luke was born in Antioch in Syria to a prosperous Greek family and was trained as a physician. St. Paul spoke about Luke as the "beloved physician."

St. Luke accompanied St. Paul on his second missionary trip. He was with Paul in Rome during St. Paul's imprisonment and final days. According to Catholic tradition, after Paul's death, St. Luke went to Greece where he wrote the Gospel. The Gospel of St. Luke is a Gospel of the poor encouraging tenderness and mercy for the oppressed.

Christ's compassion for sinners and for those in need are emphasized in this Holy Scripture. This Gospel also contains six miracles and eighteen parables of Jesus that are not found in the other three Gospels. The story of Lazarus and the Rich Man and the parable of the Good Samaritan are told in this Gospel.

St. Luke is the patron saint of physicians, artists, painters, and sculptors. On his feast day and all our days, may we "read, study or reflect on the Sacred Scriptures as strength for our faith, food for the soul, and a pure and lasting font of spiritual life" (*Catechism of Catholic Church*, 131).
