Deacon's Corner – St. Pope John XXIII

The optional memorial of St. Pope John XXIII will be celebrated on Tuesday, October 11. Born into a farming family in northern Italy, Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was always proud of his down-to-earth roots. Father Roncalli was ordained a priest in 1904 and held a variety of church offices. They included being a teacher in a seminary and Italy's national director of the Society of the Propagation of the Faith.

During World War II, as a papal delegate to Turkey, Archbishop Roncalli helped to save over 24,000 Jewish people. One month after being named a cardinal in 1953, he was elected pope. He took the name Pope John XXIII after his father and the two patrons of St. John Lateran Cathedral in Rome.

Pope John took his work seriously but not himself; rather he saw himself as a humble servant of the Lord and the people of God. In 1962, Pope John was very involved in the diplomatic efforts to resolve the Cuban missile crisis. Pope John promoted a new dialogue with the leaders of other faiths. He called for an ecumenical council, Vatican II, with an emphasis on a new liturgy and ecumenism.

Pope John died in 1963 and Pope Francis canonized him a saint in 2014. May we imitate the virtues of this saint in our lives: humility, kindness, and love of God and neighbor.
