

SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Sirach 15:15-20

This passage from Sirach gives strong, unequivocal emphasis to free will in every person. Before each of us is set, sin or virtue, life or death, and each of us are free to choose the one or the other.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:6-10

Paul explains to the Corinthians that there are two different kinds of wisdom — the wisdom of God and the wisdom of the world. The wisdom of God is mysterious, but this wisdom has been revealed "to those who love him" through the Spirit.

Gospel: Matthew 5:17-37

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells the people he has come to fulfill the law. He speaks strongly against murder and anger, against adultery and lust, and against false oaths and lies. He warns the people that unless their virtue exceeds that of the Pharisees, they "will not enter the kingdom of God."

"If you choose you can keep the commandments, they will save you; trust in God, you too shall live... Before man are life and death, good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given him... The eyes of God are on those who fear him; he understands man's every need."

DEACON'S CORNER

We celebrate the memorial for Saints Cyril, the Monk and Methodius, Bishop on Tuesday, February 14. Cyril and Methodius were brothers born in Thessalonica, Greece in a prominent Christian family. Renouncing their wealth, they were ordained priests. In 861 A.D., while living in a monastery. these two brothers were sent to Russia as missionaries and two years later to Moravia in Eastern Europe.

In this missionary work, they translated the Sacred Scriptures and liturgical books into the Slavic language. To complete these translations, Cyril created an alphabet that is currently used in Russia and some Slavic countries. This alphabet is known as the "cyrillic alphabet".

Throughout their lives, these two saints devoted their ministry to preaching the Gospel and converting the Slavic people. These missionaries are known as the "Apostles of the Slavs." Their missionary work among the Slavic people eventually led to the Christianization of Russia and Ukraine in the late 9th century.

Saints Cyril and Methodius are the patron saints of the Slavic people and ecumenism. In 1980, Pope John Paul II declared these two saints as the "copatrons of Europe" along with St. Benedict.

On this feast day, may we pray, "Saints Cyril and Methodius, who abandoned everything to preach the Gospel of the Lord, may we serve God and our sisters and brothers in love and compassion in our daily lives."
