

# OUR NEW PASTOR, FR. JIM FUKES, OFM CONV. SHARES THE FOLLOWING WITH US . . .

I was born in Utica, NY in 1961 and grew up as the middle child of nine children. At age 12, our family moved closer to Syracuse, then to Bridgeport, NY, where we lived right between two Franciscan parishes. It is there that the friars passed on their Franciscan spirituality to me.

Our family attended Saint Mary of the Assumption Church, Minoa, and St. Mary's elementary School.

For two years after high school, I worked a couple of jobs before studying two years for electronics at a local community college. I then worked at General Electric for four years before entering Franciscan formation in 1987.

I professed my vows in 1990 and was ordained to the priesthood in 1998. My first assignment was at St Joseph's Hospital in Syracuse as chaplain for 3 years. My first parish assignment was at Saint Cyril and Methodius Parish in Binghamton, NY. After 5 years I was sent to Costa Rica to become fluent in Spanish for ministry to the large Latino population in North Carolina.

I was installed as pastor of Saint Julia Catholic Church in Siler City, NC in 2006 where I remained for 8 years. For the past 8 years I was pastor of Holy Family Parish in Kingston, Ontario.

I was recently asked by an elementary school student what my favorite food is, and with my Ukrainian and Polish heritage I responded pierogi! So, I figure I will fit right in at Mother Cabrini Parish! Friar Jim

# **Deacon's Corner**

The memorial of St. Vincent de Paul, the patron saint of charitable societies, will be celebrated on Tuesday, September 27. Born in 1581 in a southern French town to a farming family, Vincent de Paul was ordained a priest at the age of 19. As a young priest, he ministered to the rich and the powerful in society. However, God's grace and an appointment to be a chaplain to a poor parish and prisoners inspired him to a vocation of working with people who were marginalized in France.

Initially, St. Vincent was described as "a hard and rough individual" but through God's transforming presence in his life, he became a tender and affectionate man who was sensitive to the needs of others. He established hospitals and an orphanage. St. Vincent also found the Congregation of the Missions, a society of priests charged with missionary efforts and the Sisters of Charity who cared for the sick and poor.

Through this saint's example, in 1883, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul was formed as a worldwide organization of lay Catholics, who follow Christ's call to serve the poor, the suffering, and the deprived. Parishes throughout our country have active St. Vincent de Paul societies serving over five million people who are in need each year.

Following St. Vincent de Paul's example, may we also serve those in need in our communities.
