This year we are pleased to welcome **Fr. Paul Prabell** who will be preaching at all the Masses on the weekend of June 4 & 5 on behalf of the Diocese of Lexington Kentucky. He is a priest of that diocese and recently celebrated his 50th Anniversary of Priesthood Ordination.

The Lexington Diocese is relatively young, being established in 1988 by St. John Paul II. Catholics comprise approximately 3% of the overall population. The diocese is about the size of Maryland, Delaware and Rhode Island combined and is in the heart of Appalachia.

It serves the rolling hills of the urban and suburban areas of Central Kentucky as well as the mountainous and rural areas of Eastern Kentucky. Because of the severe poverty of the area, the majority of Catholic parishes depend on some kind of external funding to meet daily expenses.

Please be as generous as you can with your Mission Co-Op Mission envelope the weekend of June 4 & 5 and give a warm welcome to Fr. Prabell.
