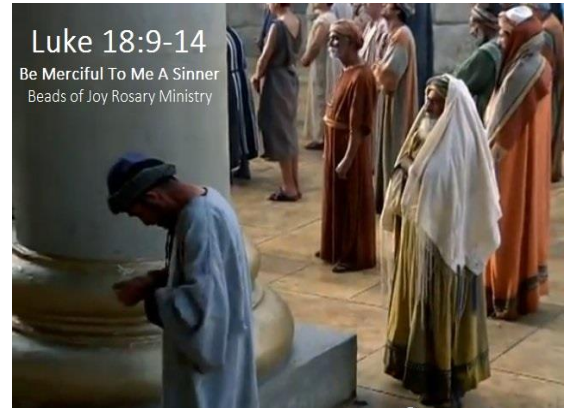

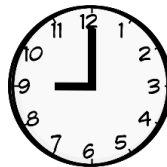

## Deacon's Corner

The feast of Saints Simon and Jude, the Apostles, will be celebrated on Friday, October 28. Both of these ordinary men were chosen by Jesus Christ "to make disciples of all nations." (Matthew 28:19) These two Apostles were known as Simon the Zealot and Jude Thaddeus. Both followed Jesus and witnessed the many miracles that He performed; dined with the Lord at the Last Supper; and saw Our Savior ascend into heaven.

After receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit, these two Apostles lived and spread the Gospel to people in the different regions of the world. After preaching in Egypt, Simon joined Jude to bring the Good News to the people in Persia and Armenia, where both were martyred in 65 AD. As members of the Church, each one of us shares in this call of the Apostles. We are invited to love Jesus and to bring the Good News of Our Lord to all that we meet in our daily lives.

St. Simon is the patron saint of couriers and St. Jude, the patron saint of hopeless or lost causes and hospital workers. May we pray on this feast of these two saints, "Lord, help me to be the person you have called me to be—to step out in faith and share your love with the world. Saints Simon and Jude, pray for us."
