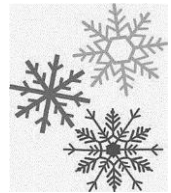

Deacon's Corner

This week, as a Church community, we celebrate the "Solemnity of All Saints" on Tuesday, November 1, a holy day of obligation. In 837, Pope Gregory IV designated November 1 as the day to remember all the saints living in God's presence. On "All Saints Day," we venerate the holy women and men who have been canonized by the Holy Church.

Saints are "persons who, after having lived a life of virtue, die in the state of grace and have been granted the reward of eternal life by God. The saints enjoy the beatific vision and unceasingly interceded for us still in earthly life." They serve as our models and inspiration for our spiritual growth in daily life (*U.S. Catholic Catechism for Adults*). May we ask the saints to pray for us.

The next day, on November 2, we celebrate the "Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed." On "All Souls Day," we remember and pray for all the faithful departed, our sisters and brothers who have died marked with the sign of faith. We continually offer our prayers, almsgiving, works of charity, and the celebration of the Holy Mass that they may attain the happiness and rewards of eternal life. May we pray, "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace."
