Ash Wednesday, this Wednesday, February 22nd Distribution of Ashes will be at the 8AM Mass, 5PM Prayer Service and 7PM Mass.

Lenten "Fast" & "Abstinence"

Catholics 18-59 are required to **fast on Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**. Catholics 14 and older are also required to **abstain from meat on those days, and on Lenten Fridays**. According to the U.S. bishops' conference, a person fasting "is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

DEACON'S CORNER

The Lenten season will begin on Ash Wednesday, February 22. The forty days of Lent are a time when we pray, fast, and perform works of mercy as a way to prepare ourselves for Christ's death and His resurrection at Easter.

During Lent, "we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully" (*U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops website*).

The Gospel of St. Matthew on this day proclaims, ""Take care not to perform righteous deeds in order that people may see them; otherwise, you will have no recompense from your heavenly Father." (6:1) The reception of ashes is a reminder that the purpose of Lent is not to perform public demonstrations of piety and penance but to seek a personal conversion of one's heart through Our Lord. Our Lenten journey is a time as we seek Christ, ask for His help, and learn to love like Jesus, Our Savior.
