Deacon's Corner

The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus will be held on Friday, June 24. This feast day has been celebrated in the Church since 1856 although the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back into the early Middle Ages. In a 17th century appearance to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a French sister, Jesus proclaimed to her, "Behold this Heart which has so loved all that it has spared nothing, even to exhausting and consuming itself, in order to testify its love."

St. Pope John Paul II explained that "in Jesus' Sacred Heart beats His infinite love and mercy for each of us, His beloved sisters and brothers." This Sacred Heart represents Jesus Christ's life who came into our world to conquer sin and death and bring us the promise of eternal salvation. It is the Heart born of the Virgin Mary; the Heart that preached the Good News; the Heart that redeemed us on the Cross; the Heart that was resurrected; and the Heart of love that continues to beat for each of us.

During our daily life, may we pray to the Sacred Heart of Jesus through short prayers known as "aspirations." These prayers may include: "Sacred Heart of Jesus, make my heart like yours;" or "Sacred Heart of Jesus, I trust in you;" and "Sacred Heart of Jesus, protect my family and have mercy on us."
