





We will celebrate the memorial for St. Anthony, Abbot on Tuesday, January 17. St. Anthony, also known as St. Anthony the Great,

was born in the third century A.D. in Egypt. When Anthony was eighteen years old, his parents died and he inherited 300 acres of land. One day, while in church, he listened to St. Matthew's Gospel being read, "If you wish to be perfect, go, sell your possessions, and give the money to the poor, and you <u>will</u> have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me."

That day, he gave his wealth away to the poor and entrusted his sister to a convent. Then, Anthony went outside the village to pray, fast, sacrifice, and do manual labor. He spent his life in solitude in the Alkaline Nitrian Desert region near Alexandria. He inspired hundreds of men and women to move into the desert and organized into small faith communities. St. Anthony was the founder of Christian monasticism and the first abbot.

St. Anthony's life helped to spread the concept of monastic life in Western Europe. He is the patron saint of skin diseases and grave diggers. St. Athanasius said, "Anthony was not known for his writings nor for his worldly wisdom, nor for any art, but simply for his reverence toward God."

On his feast day, may we pray, "Saint Anthony, pray for us to persevere in our <u>faith</u> and our practice. Help us to wake up each day with a new <u>zeal</u> for the <u>Christian life</u>."
