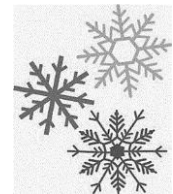

Deacon's Corner

The memorial for St Martin of Tours, Bishop, will be celebrated on Friday November 11. As a young adult, he followed his father into the Roman Calvary and served in the emperor's guard. One day, he met a poor and unclothed man. Martin removed his cloak and cut it in half with his sword. He gave this piece of the cloak to the person in need. In a dream that night, Martin saw Christ who said, "Martin has clothed me with this garment."

At age of 23, he refused his military pay and informed his commander: "I have served you as a soldier; now let me serve Christ. Give the bounty to those who are going to fight. But I am a soldier of Christ and it is not lawful for me to fight." He was discharged from military service.

Martin became a monk in Milan and was appointed as an exorcist. He traveled to France where he preached the Good News to the people in the countryside. St. Martin built the first monastery in France and was appointed the third bishop of Tours. During this time, he confronted various heresies, was renowned as a miracle worker performing many cures and was an extraordinary evangelist.

St. Martin is the patron saint of the poor, soldiers, and conscientious objectors. Like St. Martin, may we help others in need through our parish charities such as Cabrini Cupboard, Shepherd's Table, Hope Pantry, Patrick's Clothing Closet, and Patrick's Pantry.
