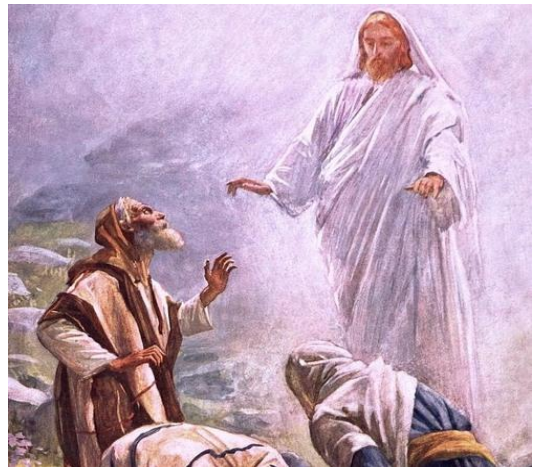

Religious Education & Sacrament Preparation

Registration for the Religious Education and Sacrament Programs will be held on August 6, 2023 at Our Lady of Hope Parish Hall. Registration for the Sacraments include student from Our Lady of Lourdes. Registration times are as follows:

5:00PM First Penance/Communion. Any child that will be in 2nd grade and already completed 1 year of Religious Education or attended 1st grade at Lourdes, will be eligible for registration of these Sacraments. There is a \$10.00 registration fee.

5:30PM for Religious Education. Registration fee \$30.00/child. Requirements will be presented to parents at this time.

6:15PM Confirmation Candidates - Grade 6 candidates will be registered along with 7th or 8th grade students that were **not** registered last year. There is a registration fee of \$30.00 for new registrations and \$10.00 retreat fee for grade 8. The Transfiguration of the Lord

First Reading: Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

Daniel depicts God as a judge with many people standing before him. He also describes a man who came to him, and was given power over all other people. This power is described as everlasting and never to be destroyed.

Second Reading: 2 Peter 1:16-19

Peter discusses how the disciples witnessed Jesus being honored and spoken to by God, fulfilling all the prophecies. He also reminds us that these prophecies were God's words, delivered through a person moved by the Holy Spirit.

Gospel: Matthew 17:1-9

Jesus took three of his disciples to a high mountain, where Elijah and Moses appeared and spoke to him. Peter suggested they make three tents, one each for Jesus, Moses and Elijah. While he spoke, a voice came from a cloud saying, "This is my Son, the beloved one; listen to him." The disciples became very afraid and fell to their knees. Jesus told them to rise and not to be afraid. As they looked up, they saw only Jesus. As they left the mountain, Jesus warned the disciples not to mention this until he had risen from the dead. Although they did not understand, they obeyed.

The Transfiguration of the Lord

The Memorial of St. Dominic, Priest will be celebrated on Tuesday, August 8. St. Dominic was born to a noble and holy family in Caleruega, Spain in 1170. He studied at the University of Palencia for ten years. During this time, he sold his possessions and collection of books to help the poor.

St. Dominic established the Order of Friar Preachers – the Dominicans. These friars live simple and austere lives. This order was to be supported by alms and still is to the present day. The work of this order is preaching and study. St. Dominic preached in France, Spain, and Italy. He is the patron saint of astronomers and falsely accused people.

St. Dominic had a vision of the Blessed Mother, who showed him a wreath of roses, representing the rosary. She told St. Dominic to pray the rosary daily, to teach it to others, and that true faith will triumph in the end. St. Dominic is often credited with the rosary, but it pre-dates him. He certainly encouraged people to pray the rosary. The rosary strengthened and enriched his own spiritual life.

On his feast day, let us pray the prayer of St. Dominic, "May God the Father, who made us, bless us. May God the Son, who redeemed us, send healing into our midst. May God the Holy Spirit, who gives us life, move within us. May God give us eyes to see God, ears to hear God, and hands to bring God's work into the world."
