

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER OR SUNDAY OF DIVINE MERCY

First Reading: Acts 2:42-47

In the early days of the Church in Jerusalem, the faithful listened intently to the teachings of the apostles. They lived a communal life, sharing all property in common and praying and taking their meals together.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 1:3-9

In this first letter from Peter, he speaks to the Christians with great joy and confidence, reminding them that through Christ's resurrection, they have been given a new birth and are heirs to the kingdom of heaven.

Gospel: John 20:19-31

After his resurrection, Jesus appears to his disciples and gives them the power to forgive sins. Thomas, who is absent, sees Christ later and believes in His resurrection after feeling His wounds. Christ admonishes Thomas by saying, "You became a believer because you saw Me. Blessed are they who have not seen and believed."

Deacon's Corner

This Sunday is known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

The Gospel of St. John (20:19-31) tells us that the Apostles, except Thomas, were in the Upper Room. They are concerned about their safety; Our Lord has been crucified; His tomb is empty; and they left or denied Jesus when He needed them.

Then, the Risen Christ appears to them in this locked room and wishes them "Shalom" or "Peace." It is a greeting of mercy and forgiveness. Jesus commissions the Apostles to continue the divine work that He has begun by building His Holy Church on this earth. He says to them, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." The word "Apostle" means, "one who is sent."

Like the Apostles, Jesus also sends each of us into our homes, neighborhoods, and towns to proclaim the Good News by our words and actions. We are called to live for Jesus and to love others as Jesus loves. As the baptized, we are sent to proclaim "that God is love, Christ saves, and Christ is alive" (*Christus Vivit, Chapter 4*).

We do not perform these works of mercy and love by ourselves. Pope Francis explains, "When you receive the Holy Spirit, he draws you ever more deeply into the heart of Christ, so that you can grow in His love, His life and His power" (*Christus Vivit*, 130). The Holy Spirit will help us in the mission that we have been given by the Risen Lord.

"Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple area and to breaking bread in their homes. They ate their meals with exultation and sincerity of heart, praising God and enjoying favor with all the people. Every day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved."

The Acts of the Apostles describe the life of the first Christian community. May we take a minute to apply this example to our parish community, parish societies or bible study groups. We celebrate the Eucharist weekly, but we live the entire week, conscious of the needs of others, the sick, the lonely, the homeless; for after being fed by the Lord, we become His presence to others.
