combined at the 8:30AM Mass.

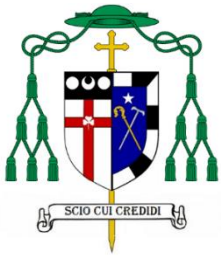
On Monday, July 3rd, our new Parish Office

A Biography of Most Reverend Timothy C. Senior Twelfth Bishop of Harrisburg

Bishop Timothy Senior was ordained an Auxiliary Bishop of Philadelphia in July, 2009. On April 2, 2023, he was named the twelfth

Bishop of Harrisburg by Pope Francis. Prior to this appointment, he was the Regional Bishop of Montgomery County and Philadelphia-South, as well as Chancellor of Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary, in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

Prior to these responsibilities with the Archdiocese, Bishop Senior served as Rector of Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary from 2012 to 2022, after having been the Moderator of the Curia of the Archdiocese and served in the Archdiocesan Secretariat for Catholic Human Services.

A 1977 graduate of Lansdale Catholic High School, Lansdale, PA., Bishop Senior is a classically trained pianist and the youngest of the three children of the late James H. and Elise Rothwell Senior. He was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia in 1985. He earned a Masters of Divinity and Master of Arts in theology from Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary, served as an assistant pastor at the parish in Bucks County and taught religion in an Archdiocesan high school. He was then assigned to graduate studies at Boston College, earning his Masters in Social Work and Masters in Business Administration in 1992.

In 1998, he was named Honorary Chaplain to His Holiness. On June 21, 2023, he was installed as the Twelfth Bishop of Harrisburg by Archbishop of Philadelphia.

Our beautiful, serene prayer garden here at Mother Cabrini is getting a much needed make



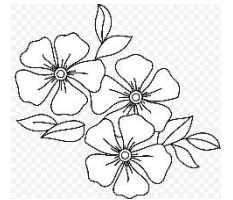

DEACON'S CORNER

The Memorial of Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, Virgin will be celebrated on Friday, July 14. St. Kateri, also known as the "Lily of the Mohawks," is the first Native American to be canonized by the Church in 2012. She lived a life of holiness and was devoted to the Holy Eucharist. St. Kateri took a vow of chastity dedicating herself to Jesus Christ.

St. Kateri was born in 1656 near the town of Auriesville, New York. She was the daughter of a Mohawk chief and warrior and her mother was a Christian Algonquin. Father Jacques de Lambertville, a French missionary, baptized her on Easter in 1676 at the age of twenty. She devoted her entire life to prayer, penance, attending daily mass, and caring for the sick and the elderly. When she died at the age of 24, witnesses reported that the scars and smallpox marks on her face disappeared and it became beautiful. St Kateri's last words were, "Jesus, I love you."

St. Kateri is the patron saint of Native Americans, orphans, environment, and World Youth Day. There is a parish named in her honor in Spring Mills, Pennsylvania near State College in Centre County. On her feast day, may we pray, "Saint Kateri, we ask your humble and pious intercession to inspire us to attain the virtues which came to you—to be uncomplaining, contemplative in spirit, chaste in body, pious, and charitable to all."
