

Deacon's Corner

The Memorial for St. Cecilia, virgin and martyr, will be celebrated on Wednesday, November 22. In the second or third century St. Cecilia, born a Christian, was a member of a wealthy Roman family. After the martyrdom of her husband, Valerius, a convert, she continued the work of converting people to the faith and burying the Christian dead, even though it was against the law. Many people in Rome were baptized through the strength and witness of her faith.

St. Cecilia refused to worship false gods and to stop burying the dead. This refusal led to her eventual arrest by the Roman authorities and her death. As she laid dying, St. Cecilia crossed her hands in prayer professing her faith in the Most Holy Trinity. She was buried in the Catacomb of Saint Callistus. Her feast day was celebrated in the Church as early as 545.

St. Cecilia is one of the early virgin martyrs of Rome. Her name appears in the Roman Canon of the Mass in Eucharistic Prayer 1; as she is one of the seven women commemorated in the Roman Canon. St. Cecilia is the patron saint of musicians, composers, instrument makers, and poets. There is a story that she heard heavenly music on her wedding day as she sat and sang to God in her heart.

On her feast day, may we pray, "While in our hearts and tongues we try, With song to praise God twice, We ask dear saint, to help us be united close to Christ!"
