Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Exodus 22:20-26

This passage from the book of Exodus enjoins all to adhere to specific religious and social laws. It urges all to act with justice and compassion towards others.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:5c-10

Paul praises the Thessalonians for receiving the word of God so eagerly and totally. Word of their faithfulness has spread throughout Macedonia and Greece; they have become a model for all Christians.

Gospel: Matthew 22:34-40

Matthew recounts the incident in which a lawyer, seeking to entrap Jesus, asks, "Teacher, which commandment of the law is the greatest?" With simplicity and authority, Jesus responds that the first commandment is to love God with one's entire being; the second is to love one's neighbor as oneself.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY

> Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 29, 2023

"You shall not molest or oppress an alien, for you were once aliens yourselves in the land of Egypt. You shall not wrong any widow or orphan. If ever you wrong them and they cry out to me, I will surely hear their cry. My wrath will flare up, and I will kill you with the sword; then your own wives will be widows, and your children orphans.... You shall love the Lord your God... you shall love your neighbor as yourself."

From the earliest biblical texts, we are taught that our love of God is expressed in our love for our neighbor. From the earliest texts of the New Testament, we find the first Christians anxious about their care for widows and orphans. It was this concern which led to the choice of the first deacons in the church in the service of those in need.

Do not let the reference of 'aliens' in the bible to mean people from outer space. Our country was founded by people coming in search of a better life, religious freedom, and a peaceful existence. Although errors were made in usurping land and introducing disease and discrimination, we are together to live our lives for the well-being of all. Pope Francis, his namesake from Assisi and Charles de Foucauld teach us that we are Christians when see the other as our brother and sister.

Deacon's Corner

The Solemnity of the Saints or "All Saints Day" will be celebrated on Wednesday, November 1, a holy day of obligation. In 609 A.D., All Saints Day was instituted by Pope Boniface IV, who consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs.

The preface for the Mass on this day explains this feast, "Around your throne the saints, our brothers and sisters, sing your praise forever. Their glory fills us with joy, and their communion with us in your church gives us inspiration and strength as we hasten on our pilgrimage of faith." These saints are our brothers and sisters, who are in communion with us and who are able to strengthen us by their intercessions and prayers, since we are on the same spiritual journey which they have completed.

On this day, we venerate the holy women and men who have been canonized by the Holy Church. Saints are "persons who, after having lived a life of virtue, die in the state of grace and have been granted the reward of eternal life by God. The saints enjoy the beatific vision and unceasingly interceded for us still in earthly life." They serve as our models and inspiration for our spiritual growth in daily life (*U.S. Catholic Catechism for Adults*). On this holy day, may we pray, "O Lord, give us the protection of the saints. Grant us their assistance in overcoming temptation and gaining the fullness of life with You. Amen."
