Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Isaiah 5:1-7

This passage about the failure of the Lord's vineyard is a metaphor for the ingratitude of the people of Israel and Judah. In tones of sadness and rebuke, the Lord asks, "What more was there to do for my vineyard?"

Second Reading: Philippians 4:6-9

In a moving appeal to the Philippians, Paul exhorts them to embrace all that is pure, decent, and admirable; then God's peace will be theirs.

Gospel: Matthew 21:33-43

In another rebuke to the chief priests and the elders, Jesus recounts a parable in which the owner of a vineyard leases his vineyard to tenant farmers. When the owner sends his servants and even his son to claim his rightful share of the crops, the tenants kill all of them. With some bitterness, Jesus warns the chief priests that "the Kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to people that will yield a rich harvest.

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time October 8, 2023

"Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with Thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus...keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me. Then the God of peace will be with you."

When we receive a greeting card, we often hastily read the message, but respond with silent gratitude for the sender, their thoughtfulness in sharing their message with us. Consider this as you reread the message of St. Paul.

In offering encouragement to the Philippians, he exhorts them in their prayer to include, as all prayer should, both requests, gratitude and need. The fruit of prayer is the peace of God. As he completes this teaching he offers himself as a model as teacher and witness. The church asks us to accept Paul as a pattern and write our own message mirrored in the words he included in his card.

Deacon's Corner

The optional memorial for St. Pope John XXIII will be celebrated on Wednesday, October 11. Pope John XXIII was born Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli, one of thirteen children of a farming family, at Sotto il Monte, Italy in 1881. He entered the Bergamo seminary and in 1904 he was ordained a priest. Serving in various church roles, he was a teacher at a seminary in Rome, a papal diplomat to Bulgaria, Turkey, and France, and became a cardinal in 1953.

With the death of Pope Pius XII, he was elected Pope on October 28, 1958, taking the name Pope John XIII. His pontificate lasted 5 years and he was known for his warmth and humor. As Pope, he was described as a simple, humble, meek, and active Shepherd of the Church. He continued his ministry of visiting the sick and those in prison and welcomed people from every faith and country. The people called him, "Good Pope John."

In 1962, Pope John XXIII became involved in resolving the Cuban Missile Crisis. In this same year, he called for the Second Vatican Council. After his death in 1963, Pope Francis canonized Pope John in 2014. On his feast day, may we pray, "St. John XXIII, pray for us so that we do not limit ourselves to mourn the darkness but rather to enkindle the light, bringing Christ everywhere and always praying to Mary. Amen."
