

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 30, 2023

"God said, 'Ask something of me and I will give it to you.' Solomon answered: 'Oh Lord, my God, you have made me, your servant, king to succeed my father David; but I am a mere youth, not knowing at all how to act. Give me therefore, an understanding heart to judge your people and to distinguish right from wrong. Because you have asked for this... for understanding so that you may know what is right - I do as you requested.""

There is the adage 'be careful what you ask for, you may just get it.' Although Solomon was endowed with many gifts, he asked for the gift of understanding. It is one of the gifts of the Spirit for us. From it flow kindness, forgiveness, joy and hope. We have just witnessed the coronation of a king. What is he asking for?

When I approach my God in prayer, what do I ask for? Do I go before Him with great confidence? What do I really need, what is my basic want in prayer? Did Jesus not say, 'ask and you shall receive, seek and you will find, knock and it shall be given to you?

DEACON'S CORNER

The Memorial of St. Ignatius of Loyola, Priest will be celebrated on Monday, July 31. Born in 1491 in northern Spain, as a young man, St. Ignatius became a soldier in the Spanish army. He was wounded in a battle with the French. As Ignatius was recovering, he experienced a conversion by reading about the lives of Jesus Christ and the saints. Through this spiritual transformation, St. Ignatius became involved in spiritual direction. Living outside of the town of Manresa, he began to write his prayers and insights in his book, Spiritual Exercises, which has become an influential book for individual discernment and retreats. Called to the priesthood, he completed his studies at the University of Paris and was ordained. Then, with a group of friends, who included St. Francis Xavier and St. Peter Faber, St. Ignatius founded the Society of Jesus, or the Jesuits. For the next 15 years, St. Ignatius lead the Jesuit order. Jesuits have established churches, schools, and universities throughout the world. St. Ignatius is the patron saint of retreats, education, and soldiers. On this Memorial, may we pray St. Ignatius' Suscipe Prayer, "Take Lord, and receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, and my entire will, all that I have and possess. Thou hast given all to me. To Thee, O Lord, I return it. All is Thine, dispose of it wholly according to Thy will. Give me Thy love and Thy grace, for this is sufficient for me."
