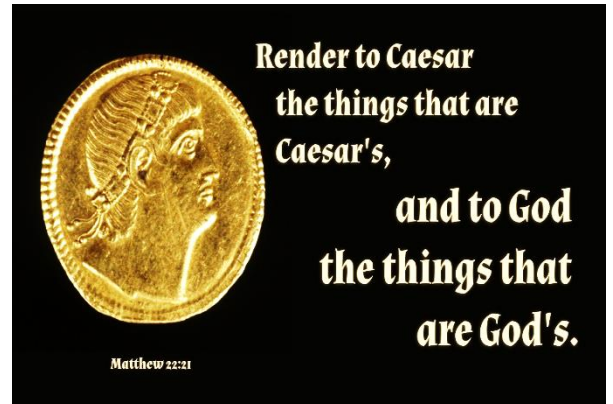

Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Isaiah 45:1, 4-6

Cyrus, King of Persia and friend to the Jewish people, becomes the Lord's anointed one, and through God's intervention, returns the Jews to their own country.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5b

Paul rejoices that the Thessalonians, newly converted to Christianity, are displaying remarkable constancy in their new-found faith.

Gospel: Matthew 22:15-21

Seeking to entrap Jesus in his speech, the hostile and hypocritical Pharisees ask him this dangerous question, "Is it lawful to pay tax to the emperor or not?" Realizing their treacherous motives, Jesus asks for a Roman coin, and pointing to the inscription of Caesar's, he answers, "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, but give to God what is God's."

Deacon's Corner

The feast of Saint Jude Thaddeus will be celebrated on Saturday, October 28. St. Jude was a son of Clopas and his mother Mary was the Virgin Mary's cousin. He was one of the 12 Apostles of Jesus Christ. St. Jude preached the Good News in difficult circumstances in Mesopotamia, Libya, and Persia helping to build the early Church in these regions.

St. Jude may have been martyred in Armenia or Beirut. After his death, St. Jude's body was brought to Rome and interred in a crypt in St. Peter's Basilica. Two saints, Saint Bridget of Sweden and St. Bernard had visions from God asking them to accept St. Jude as "The Patron Saint of the Impossible." Today, he is the patron saint of Hope and Hopeless Cases.

The novena prayer of Saint Jude to be said for 9 consecutive days is: "Most holy Apostle, St. Jude, faithful servant and friend of Jesus, the Church honors and invokes you universally as the patron of hope. Please intercede on my behalf. Make use of that particular privilege given to you to bring hope, comfort, and help where they are needed most. Come to my assistance in this great need that I may receive the consolation and help of heaven as I work with my challenges, particularly (here make your request). I praise God with you and all the saints forever. I promise, blessed St. Jude, to be ever mindful of this great favor, to always honor you as my special and powerful patron, and to gratefully encourage devotion to you. Amen."
