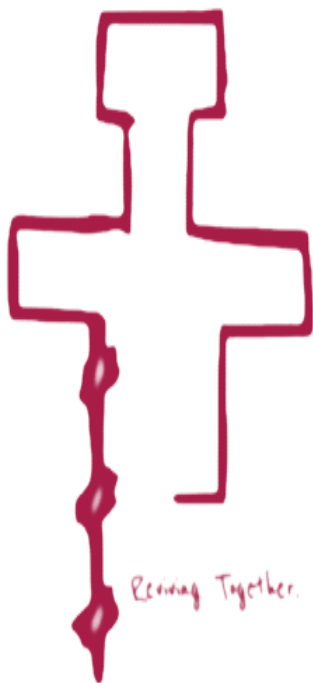

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts 2:14, 22-33

After the Holy Spirit descends upon the apostles, Peter preaches with great enthusiasm to both Jews and Christians. He recalls for them in vivid terms the miracles and wonders that Jesus performed.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 1:17-21

Peter makes reference to the Passover, when the Jews escaped from Egypt because the blood of the paschal lamb was shed. Now they are being saved from sin by the blood of Christ, the Lamb of the New Testament.

Gospel: Luke 24:13-35

Jesus reveals Himself to two disciples on the way to Emmaus. After explaining to them the passages in Scripture which referred to Him, Christ "took bread, broke it, and distributed it to them." Then they recognized Christ and their "hearts burned within them."

Deacon's Corner

The feast of St. Mark the Evangelist will be celebrated on Tuesday, April 25, which is the day of his martyrdom and death. St. Mark was born in 5 A.D. in Cyrene, which is the present-day country of Libya. Mark was a close friend of St. Peter who described him as "Mark, my son" ([1 Peter 5:13](#)). St. Peter instructed and baptized Mark in the Christian faith.

In 50 A.D., St. Mark wrote one of the Gospels which is the shortest of the four Gospels. Originally, it was written for Roman Gentiles. The Gospel of St. Mark presents a beautiful and detailed description of Jesus' public life. St. Mark preached the Good News in Egypt where he was the Bishop of Alexandria. He founded the first church in Africa. After ministering to the people of Alexandria for twenty years, he was martyred. St. Mark is the patron saint of attorneys, prisoners, Italy, and other causes.

Most importantly, St. Mark is one of God's evangelists who faithfully wrote down the life of Jesus Christ in Holy Scripture for us to read, meditate on, and act upon as His disciples. These words of God support us in changing our hearts and giving our lives to Jesus, Our Risen Lord. During this week, let us go to the Gospel of St. Mark in the Bible and read a passage(s) and prayerfully reflect on its meaning(s) for our lives.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS - HIS WORD TODAY

Third Sunday of Easter - April 23, 2023

"...Conduct yourselves with reverence during the time of your sojourning, realizing that you were ransomed from your futile conduct, handed on by your ancestors, not with perishable things like silver or gold but with the precious blood of Christ as of a spotless unblemished lamb."

The first Christians received ongoing formation in their newfound faith. One method was to listen to the teachings found in the letters of Peter and Paul, offering words of encouragement and support. Familiarize yourself with this text of Peter, reminding us where we once were and what has been given us through the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. They, and we, were ransomed and saved by the blood of Jesus. We are still in Easter time.

Unfortunately we forget this. Even today we hear of people paying ransom to rescue family members from cartels in Latin America or gangs in Haiti. How fortunate that we have been rescued, as we pray for today's victims of violence and oppression.
