

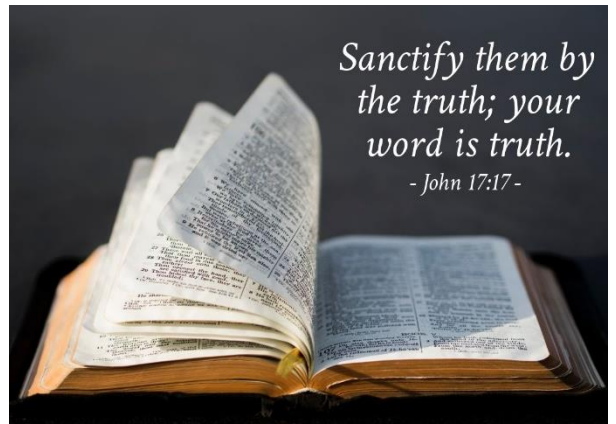

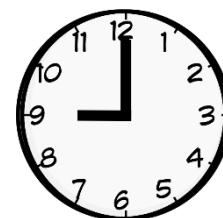

Deacon's Corner

We celebrate the feast of the Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael, the Archangels, on Wednesday, September

29th. These archangels are three of the seven archangels who stand before the throne of God. They are the only angels named in Sacred Scripture. All three of these angels have important roles in salvation history.

St. Michael, whose name means "Who is like God?" is the Prince of Heavenly Host and the leader of all angels. He cast down Lucifer and his evil spirits, who rebelled against God, into hell. Catholic tradition explains the other roles of St. Michael are to escort the faithful to heaven at the hour of their death and to be a champion of all Christians and the Church. He is the patron saint of police officers, doctors, military personnel and grocers.

St. Gabriel, whose name means "God's strength" serves as a messenger for God. Gabriel appears to Daniel in the Old Testament to explain his visions. In two prominent occurrences, he announces the birth of John the Baptist to his father Zacharias and the Incarnation of the Word in the womb of Blessed Mother. St. Gabriel is the patron saint of messengers, telecommunication workers, and postal workers.

St. Raphael, whose name means "God has healed," was described in the Book of Tobit when Tobit was healed of his blindness. St. Raphael is the patron saint of travelers, the blind, nurses, physicians and medical workers.

In his daily meditation on this feast, Pope Francis explains the roles of these archangels, "Michael defends us, Gabriel gives us the Good News and Raphael takes us by the hand and walks with us; he helps us with the many things that occur along the journey." May we ask these angels to pray for us.

At that time, John said to Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us." Jesus replied, "Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me. For whoever is not against us is for us. Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward.

"Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life maimed than with two hands to go into Gehenna, into the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life crippled than with two feet to be thrown into Gehenna. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. Better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye than with two eyes to be thrown into Gehenna, where 'their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched.'"

Profession of Faith

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.
