# Deacon's Corner

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross will be celebrated on Tuesday, September 14. St. John's Gospel on this feast

proclaims, "For God so loved the world that He gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:16-17) This feast day is the commemoration of Jesus' salvific death on the Cross and His Resurrection, which defeated death and opened to all who believe eternal salvation with Our Lord in Heaven.

The True Cross was discovered around 320 A.D. In this time period, St. Helena went on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Her purpose was to build churches on the sites of the most important events in Jesus' life. She also wanted to discover the True Cross. When she arrived in Jerusalem, she discovered that the Romans had built a temple to the goddess Venus over Calvary, the site of Jesus' Crucifixion. As the workers disassembled this structure, they broke into a cistern which contained three crosses, one which was determined to be the True Cross of Christ.

The Cross of Jesus is a central sign of our Catholic faith. At the beginning of Mass on this feast day, the Entrance Antiphon emphasizes the importance of this feast. This prayer reads, "We should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered." (Galatians 6:14)

With humility and thanksgiving on this feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, may we pray in the words of St. Francis of Assisi, "We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You, because by Your Holy Cross You have redeemed the world."

You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

He summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
