Deacon's Corner

On this 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time, in the gospel of
St. Luke, Jesus tells us a parable about the Pharisee
and the tax collector who went to the Temple to pray.

The Pharisee's words to God are words of pride,
thinking that he is better than other people. In contrast,
the tax collector talks with God from his heart. He does
not say anything about his accomplishments. Rather,
the tax collector tells God, "O God, be merciful to me, a
sinner." This man is humble and honest with Our Lord.

Daily prayer is important in strengthening our
relationship with God. We need to make time each day
to know and love God. Like the tax collector, each one
of us needs to be honest, for God hears the prayer of
the humble. In our first reading, according to the Book
of Sirach, "The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds; it
does not rest till it reaches its goal, nor will it withdraw
till the Most High responds."

Let us pray daily and make it a priority in our lives. Talk
honestly with God from the heart about everything in
our lives like the tax collector—our fears, hopes, work,
families and the need for His help. We will hear His
voice and Our Lord will give us the strength in our lives
like we heard in our second reading how God
strengthened Paul in his life trials.
