Deacon's Corner

Sunday of Divine Mercy The Second Sunday of Easter on April 7 is Divine Mercy Sunday. In the 1930's, Jesus chose a Polish sister, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her diary. On May 5, 2000, five days after her canonization, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday. (U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops) In His vision to St. Faustina, Jesus appeared with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from His heart. The Lord requested that "Jesus. I trust in You" be inscribed under His image. Jesus asked that His image be venerated throughout the world, "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, number 48) and "By means of this image, I will grant many graces to

The 'Chaplet of Divine Mercy' was also given to St. Faustina with the promise, "encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you" (Diary, number 1541). "Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. Even if they were a sinner most hardened, if they were to recite this chaplet only once, they would receive grace from My infinite mercy" (Diary, number 687).
