Deacon's Corner

On Monday, February 5, we celebrate the Memorial of St. Agatha, virgin and martyr. She is also known as "Agatha of Sicily" and is one of the most venerated virgin martyrs of the Catholic Church. St. Agatha was born into a noble family in 231 and from childhood dedicated her life to God.

Quintianus, a high-ranking diplomatic Roman official, wanted to force her to turn away from her religion and her vow of celibacy by forcing her to marry him. She refused. He had her imprisoned and continuously tortured to change her mind. During these trials, St. Agatha had a vision of the Apostle, St. Peter, who comforted her and healed her wounds through his prayers.

St. Agatha is the patron saint of Sicily, breast cancer patients and rape victims. She is considered to be a powerful intercessor when people suffer from fires.

On her feast day, may we pray, "Saint Agatha, you suffered assault and indignity because of your faith and purity. Help to heal all those who are survivors of assault and protect those women who are in danger. Amen."
