Deacon's Corner

On this Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, in our Gospel, Jesus tells the Pharisees and us, the story of the Rich Man and Lazarus. This parable describes the story of a rich man who "is dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day." _This man "ignores a poor beggar named Lazarus, who is covered in sores and lives in poverty." Both men die and their fates are reversed in the afterlife. Lazarus is comforted in paradise while the rich man is tormented in hell. Luke 16:19-31).

This rich man was not condemned because of his wealth but for his indifference to Lazarus who was suffering and poor. Jesus calls us to act in mercy with all who are poor and suffering. In his visit to the United States, St. Pope John Paull II addressed the crowd in Yankee Stadium. He said, "The parable of the rich man and Lazarus must always be present in our memory; it must form our conscience. Christ demands openness to our brothers and sisters in need. We cannot stand idly by, enjoying our own resources and freedom, if, in any place, the Lazarus of the 21st century stands at our doors."

As Jesus's followers, we might not be able to solve the entrenched issues of poverty and suffering alone. However, we can perform small acts of love in our daily lives, such as donating food items, volunteering at a food pantry or bringing Holy Communion to hospital patients or the homebound.
