

Deacon's Corner

On the Second Sunday of Lent, the Gospel of St.

Mark describes the Transfiguration of Jesus. High on a mountain, Christ was transfigured and "His clothes became dazzling white." Then, a cloud came over Peter, James and John who accompanied Jesus and a voice proclaims, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to Him" (Mark 9: 2-20). In this proclamation, God the Father reveals to the three Apostles and us that Jesus is His beloved Son. As the Apostles descend the mountain with Jesus, they are amazed and full of joy.

This Transfiguration shows us who Jesus really is – the Son of God and Our Savior who comes into our world to bring us hope and to save us from sin and death. Like these Apostles, let us make time during this second week of Lent to listen to God's beloved Son in prayer and in charitable actions with our sisters and brothers. In these times, may we ask Him, How are you asking me to change? What are you asking me to do?

As we seek answers to these questions, there are many ways that we can quietly listen to Jesus and ask for His grace and help. Make time to read a passage from this week's Gospels and prayerfully meditate on God's Word. Perform a charitable act of mercy or kindness in God's holy name. Say a prayer for those who are poor, suffering or most in need of God's mercy. Ask the Holy Spirit for an increase in understanding and wisdom to follow Jesus in daily life.
