Deacon's Corner

Memorial of Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, Virgin

The Memorial of Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, Virgin, will be celebrated on Friday, July 14. St. Kateri, also known as the "Lily of the Mohawks", is the first Native American to be canonized by the Church in 2012. She lived a life of holiness and was devoted to the Holy Eucharist. St. Kateri took a vow of chastity dedicating herself to Jesus.

St. Kateri was born in 1656 near the town of Auriesville, New York. She was the daughter of a Mohawk chief and warrior and her mother was a Christian Algonquin. Father Jacques de Lambertville, a French missionary, baptized her on Easter 1676 at the age of twenty. She devoted her entire life to prayer, penance, attending daily mass, and caring for the sick and the elderly. When she died at the age of 24, witnesses reported that the scars and smallpox marks on her face, disappeared and it became beautiful. St. Kateri's last words were, "Jesus, I love you."

St. Kateri is the patron saint of Native Americans, orphans, environment and World Youth Day. There is a parish named in her honor in Spring Mills, Pennsylvania near State College in Centre County. On her feast day, may we pray, "St. Kateri, we ask your humble and pious intercession to inspire us to attain the virtues which came to you—to be uncomplaining, contemplative in spirit, chaste in body, pious and charitable to all.
