Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God The Octave Day of Christmas

The Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, will be celebrated on Monday, January 1. This liturgical celebration falls on January 1 exactly one week after Christmas, the end of the octave of Christmas. We honor the Blessed Virgin Mary as the Mother of God because she conceived and gave birth to Jesus Christ, Our Savior. This solemnity recognizes Mary's faith and trust in God.

Our Blessed Mother is the "Theotokos," which comes from Greek meaning, "God-bearer." In 431 A.D., this title was approved at the Council of Ephesus when the Church fathers finalized the teaching that the one born of Mary was indeed the Son of God. This was done to combat false teachings about Jesus.

The Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, *Lumen Gentium*, explains, "the Virgin Mary, who at the message of the angel, received the Word of God in her heart and in her body and gave life to the world, is acknowledged and honored as being truly the mother of God and mother of the Redeemer. Redeemed by reason of the merits of her Son and united to Him by a close and indissoluble tie, she is endowed with the high office and dignity of being the Mother of the Son of God" (no. 53).

On this solemnity, may we pray, "Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us."


