

DEACON'S CORNER St. Andrew, Apostle

The feast of St. Andrew, one of the twelve Apostles of Jesus Christ, will be celebrated on Thursday, November 30. He was born in Bethsaida and was the brother of Simon (St. Peter). In St. Matthew's Gospel, we hear, "As Jesu's was walking by the sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers. Simon and his brother Andrew. casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him" (Matthew 4:18-20).

St. Andrew was present and active as a disciple in Jesus' public ministry. Like the other Apostles, Andrew became a missionary. Legend tells us that he preached the Good News in Greece, Turkey and the southern part of Russia. He was crucified at Patras in Greece on an X-shaped cross, which ever since has been called the St. Andrew's cross.

Beginning on his feast day, one may say the St. Andrew Christmas Novena Prayer. The novena prayer is "Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born Of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in the piercing cold. In that hour vouchsafe, I beseech Thee, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His blessed Mother. Amen"

It is believed that that whoever prays the St. Andrew Christmas Novena Prayer 15 times each day from the feast of St. Andrew (November 30th) until Christmas Eve will obtain the favor requested.
