#### **Deacon's Corner**

The optional memorial of St. Elizabeth of Portugal will be celebrated on Tuesday, July 5. St. Elizabeth, a Spanish princess, was born in 1271. She was given in marriage by her father, King Peter III to King Denis of Portugal at the age of twelve. Throughout her life, St. Elizabeth was a very devout Catholic who attended daily Mass and practiced fasting. She acted in Christian charity and kindness aiding the poor, the sick, and those in need. She also encouraged the members of her court to follow these acts of compassion.

In her life, Queen Elizabeth was a peacemaker who directly intervened and helped her country avoid civil wars in the 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> centuries. St. Elizabeth practiced humility and faithfulness in advancing the Kingdom of God in this world and not her own earthly queenship. She is the patron saint of the Third Order of St. Francis, charity workers, and brides. After her death in 1336, many miracles were attributed to her intercessions and she was canonized a saint by Pope Urban III in 1625.

On her feast day, may we ask St. Elizabeth to pray for us. May we also imitate the virtues that she practiced in her life in loving God, loving one's neighbors, and being a peacemaker in our families and community.

## Independence Day fun facts & trivia

Independence Day was first celebrated in Philadelphia on July 8, 1776.

The word 'patriotism' comes from the Latin patria, which means 'homeland' or 'fatherland.'

Before cars ruled the roadway, the Fourth of July was traditionally the most miserable day of the year for horses, tormented by all the noise and by the boys and girls who threw firecrackers at them.

The names of the signers of the Declaration of Independence were withhold from the public for more than six months to protect the signers.

Both Thomas Jefferson and John Adams died on Independence Day, July 4, 1826.

In 1941, Congress declared 4<sup>th</sup> of July a federal legal holiday. It is one of the few federal holidays that have not been moved to the nearest Friday or Monday.
