

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME July 13, 2025

First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses petitions the people to follow the commandments God has set before them. He reminds them that the laws are not in the sky or far away at sea, but are accessible to them and meant to be followed if they wish to prosper.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:15-20

Paul discusses the divine nature of Jesus, and explains that Jesus was created before anything else. Everything else was "created through him, and for him."

Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

While discussing everlasting life, a lawyer mentions loving one's neighbor as oneself. The lawyer then asks Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus tells him about a man beaten by robbers, who was ignored by both a priest and a Levite before a Samaritan stopped and offered him aid. Jesus asks the lawyer who was neighbor to the injured man. The lawyer says "the one who treated him with compassion." Jesus encourages him to go and do the same.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 13, 2025

"There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test Jesus and said, 'Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'What is written in the law? How do you read it?'...If only you would heed the voice of the Lord, your God, and keep his commandments and statutes that are written in the book of the law, when you return to the Lord, your God, with all your heart and all your soul...it is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts, you have only to carry it out.'"

At one-time, people knew the commandments by heart, as Moses provided ten. Jesus helped us, by making them as two - love of God and neighbor. They can be reduced to the positive word 'respect.' Some telephone apps provide quizzes on geography, math or other tests like the scholar of the law. At one-time people knew them by memory. Today many would not pass the quiz. What are the ten, two, or where is the respect they call for in my life?

In the gospel of Luke, the parable of the good Samaritan provides the answer for us to carry out and inherit the gift of eternal life, now and in the future. 'To know the Father and the Son whom he has sent.'

Deacon's Corner Fifteenth Week in Ordinary Time July 13, 2025

On this Fifteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time, in St. Mark's Gospel, Jesus tells us the parable of the Good Samaritan. This specific story illustrates that loving one's neighbor means that we live our faith when we practice acts of love and compassion with all in need (Luke 10:25-37).

As Christians, we should not ask "Who is my neighbor?" Rather, we need to ask, "Am I a good neighbor to others?" The word "neighbor" means anyone who needs help that we meet each day. "One's neighbor needs to be loved with the same love with which Our Lord loves him or her." (Pope St. John Paul II, Sollicitudo ReiSocialis, 1987).

We know that the road to Jericho where the injured person lays in our Gospel's parable passes through our homes, towns, and workplaces. Like the Good Samaritan, may we ask for God's grace to support our sisters and brothers.

A true story illustrates our Gospel's message. One day, Tom Weller's car broke down in Southern California. A stranger stopped to help Weller and did not accept payment for his kindness. Instead, the stranger asked Weller to return the favor by helping others. He took those words to heart. For the last thirty years, Tom has helped thousands of stranded people along Southern California's highways. He never asks for payment. Instead, He leaves a card asking each person to help someone in need. It has become his mission to pass on the kindness that was once done for him.
