Deacon's Corner St. Boniface, Bishop and Martyr

During this Seventh Week of Easter, on Thursday, June 5, we celebrate the Memorial of St. Boniface, Bishop and Martyr. Known as the apostle of Germany, Saint Boniface was an English Benedictine monk who evangelized the Germanic tribes in this region in early 700 A.D. Pope Gregory II appointed him a missionary bishop. He set out with determination to convert the pagan tribes in Germany.

St. Boniface also established monasteries, reformed the Frankish church, and built a foundation of Christianity in Germany. Despite facing constant danger and resistance, he remained dedicated to his mission of cultivating the Good News among the people. In 754 A.D. while practicing the faith in Friesland, Boniface and his companions were martyred by pagan raiders.

Despite the daily difficulties, St. Boniface persevered in loving God and his neighbors. His commitment to spreading Christianity encourages each one us in our personal faith journeys, regardless of the challenges in our lives. Like the life of St. Boniface, reading about the saints inspire us to lead lives dedicated to Our Lord; they serve as role models; and they teach us that holiness in our lives is possible.

On this feast day, may we pray, "O God, who raised up Saint Boniface to be a patron and protector of the German people, grant that through his intercession we may remain steadfast in our faith and courageous in our witness to the Gospel. May we, like Boniface, boldly proclaim your truth and persevere in our mission to spread your love. Through Christ our Lord. Amen."
