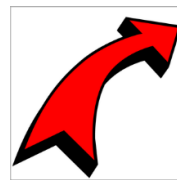

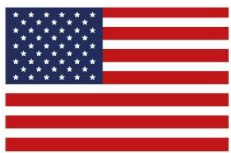
Memorial of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary

On Thursday, August 22, the Memorial of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary will be celebrated. In October 1954, Pope Pius XII proclaimed this Memorial with his encyclical letter, *Ad Caeli Reginam* (The Queen of Heaven). The Blessed Mother is the Queen of Heaven and Earth.

Mary's Queenship has foundations in Holy Scripture. At the Annunciation, the angel Gabriel announced that her Son would receive the throne of David and rule forever. At the Visitation, Elizabeth calls Mary "the mother of my Lord." As in all the mysteries of Mary's life, "she is closely associated with Jesus: Her Queenship is a share in Jesus' kingship (*Franciscan Media*)."

Pope Benedict XVI explains that Mary "is Queen in her service to God for humanity, she is a Queen of love who lives the gift of herself to God so as to enter into the plan of humanity's salvation. She answered the Angel: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord" (cf. Lk 1:38) and in the Magnificat, she sings God has regarded the low estate of his handmaiden (cf. Lk 1:48). She helps us. She is Queen precisely by loving us, by helping us in our every need; she is our sister, a humble handmaid."

On this feast, may we pray, "We beg you, O Lord, that we who celebrate the feast day of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our Queen, may merit, under her loving protection, to attain peace on this earth and glory in heaven."

TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Proverbs 9:1-6

A rich woman invites many guests to her home to eat and drink. She appeals to those who lack understanding to forsake foolishness and "advance in the way of understanding."

Second Reading: Ephesians 5:15-20

Paul advises the Ephesians to abandon foolish ways and evil deeds. All Christians should concentrate on doing God's will before all other things. He reminds them to always give thanks to God in the name of Jesus Christ.

Gospel: John 6:51-58

Jesus had just told the crowd that anyone who ate of the bread he planned to give would live forever, and that this bread was his flesh, which he would give up for the sake of the world. The people do not understand, but Jesus reassures them that his flesh is real food and that "those who feed on this bread shall live forever."
