## Second Sunday in Ordinary Time January 19, 2025

### First Reading: Isaiah 62:1-5

Isaiah prophesizes that Jerusalem will again be held in high esteem by God. He states that all nations will witness its glory. He compares a groom's joy toward his bride to the joy that God will feel toward Jerusalem.

### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

Paul discusses the different gifts and talents bestowed upon different individuals. He explains that each individual receives various talents so that everyone can contribute something to society.

### Gospel: John 2:1-11

Jesus and Mary attended a wedding where Mary informed Jesus that there was no more wine. At first he said it did not concern him, but then he turned several jugs of water into wine. His disciples were also present, and believed in him more strongly after they witnessed the first sign of glory he revealed to them.

## Deacon's Corner Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul, Apostle

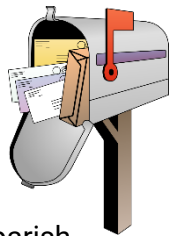
The Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul, Apostle will be celebrated on Saturday, January 25. His conversion is described in the Acts of the Apostles in chapters 9, 22, and 26. St. Paul was born Saul of Tarsus. Saul persecuted the Apostles as they preached to the people. With the approval of the high priest of the Sanhedrin, he arrested Christians and placed them into prison.

While in Damascus, he was suddenly surrounded by a great light. Falling to the ground, he heard a voice say, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?" Saul answered, "Who are you, Sir?" The voice said, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. Now, get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do." The Lord sent a disciple named Ananias to heal and instruct Saul. Ananias laid his hands on Saul and prayed over him so that he might regain his sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit.

Immediately, things like scales fell from Saul's eyes. He regained his sight and was baptized. Saul realized that Jesus was the fulfillment of all he was pursuing. He stayed in Damascus with Christian disciples and started teaching in the synagogues that Jesus was the promised Messiah and the Son of God. Saul's conversion into Paul teaches us that we too need conversion and renewal in our lives by Holy Spirit, which will enable us to bear witness to Christ by the examples of our lives.
