

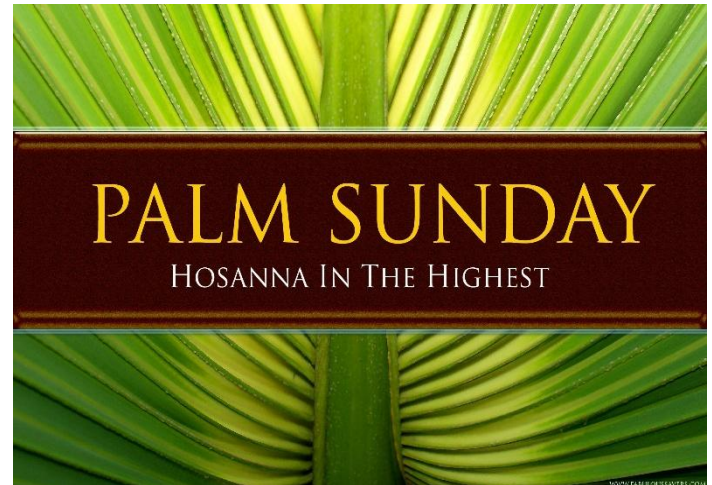

With this parish bulletin, we open the most solemn week in our Catholic calendar, **Holy Week**. In the coming days, we will celebrate **Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil/Easter Sunday**.

Collectively, these three days are officially known by the Latin term as the **“Sacred Triduum”**.

During the **Triduum**, we will once again recall and celebrate the central mysteries of our Catholic Faith. We will recall Jesus giving us our great sacraments, the Holy Eucharist and the priesthood conferred upon his disciples (Holy Orders). We will celebrate Jesus’ saving sacrifice in His crucifixion and death on Good Friday. We will joyfully celebrate his triumph over the grave at our Easter Vigil Mass and on Easter Morning.

As your pastor, *I urge you to reserve the time in your personal schedule to attend each or at least one of the Triduum services*. Great graces are given to those who participate in these Paschal celebrations.

Stations of the Cross

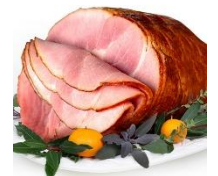
Stations of the Cross are held every Friday during Lent here at Mother Cabrini Church at 7PM

Deacon's Corner

April 13, 2025

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

In this fifth week of Lent, four of the Gospel readings during the daily masses are from Chapter eight according to St. John. In this Gospel chapter, we discover that Jesus is the "Light of the World." Christ tells us, "I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of life" (8:12).

Yet, the Pharisees question who Jesus is and where is his Father? (John 8:19). Pope Paul VI provides a beautiful answer who Jesus is. He explains, "He is the Son of God made man. He is the Messiah we were expecting, he is the Savior of the world, the Master of our lives; he is the Shepherd that guides us to their pastures in time, to their destinies beyond time. He is the joy of the world; he is the image of the invisible God; he is the way, the truth, and the life; he is the one who knows us even from afar. He knows our thoughts; he is the One who can forgive us, console, cure, even raise from the dead; and he is the One who will return, the judge of one and all in the fullness of his glory and eternal happiness." (General Audience, December 11, 1974).

This week, may we continue to embrace Our Savior in love and faith. Our Savior will offer Himself on the Holy Cross on Good Friday and rise from the dead on Easter Sunday to conquer sin and death for each one of us.

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

Isaiah describes an individual who had been taught by God to reach out to others. He also describes this individual's willingness to be beaten and spit upon, secure that with God's help, he will not be disgraced.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

Paul discusses how Jesus did not declare equality with God, but took on human form. He humbled himself enough to accept dying on the cross. God in turn exalted him and wants us to respect Jesus' name and worship him.

Gospel: Luke 22:14—23:56

Luke gives a detailed account of Jesus' last supper with the apostles, where Jesus tells them he will soon suffer in fulfillment of God's will. Then Jesus prayed that he might be spared if it suited God's will. After Judas betrayed Jesus, he was arrested. Although Pilate did not think Jesus was guilty of a crime, he gave in to the will of the people, and sentenced Jesus to death on a cross. Then Jesus was crucified and his body laid in a new tomb.

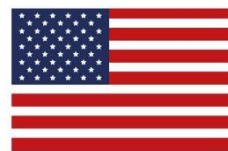
