THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER**

First Reading: Acts 3:13-15, 17-19

Peter reminds the people that they allowed Jesus to be killed, and preferred to allow a murderer to be released. But God raised him from the dead as had been prophesied. Therefore, all people should believe and turn to God, that their sins might be forgiven.

Second Reading: 1 John 2:1-5a

Jesus was offered up for the sins of the world. The only way to prove true faith in him, is to honor his commandments. Anyone who claims to believe, yet does not keep his word, does not truly believe.

Gospel: Luke 24:35-48

Jesus appeared to two disciples, though at first they feared he was a ghost. Jesus ate with them to prove he was not a ghost. He explained that he had fulfilled the prophets words about him. He also explained that in his name they must preach doing penance for the forgiveness of sins.

Deacon's Corner Third Week of Easter

This week, we celebrate the third week of Easter. In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus continues to appear to His disciples after His Glorious Resurrection. Two disciples describe to the others how Jesus appeared to them on their way to Emmaus. While they were speaking, Christ appears in their midst and says, "Peace be with you." They are startled thinking they see a ghost. Jesus encourages them to look at His hands and feet. He asks them if they have anything to eat. They offer him a piece of baked fish.

After this simple meal, Jesus "opens their minds to understand the Scriptures." He says to them, "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, would be preached in His name . . . You are witnesses of these things" (Luke 24: 35-48). Like the disciples in this Gospel, Jesus also needs us as witnesses to continue His mission on this earth.

Christ, Our Savior, desires each one of us to be His eyes, ears, hands, and feet to bear witness of His love, mercy, and forgiveness with our sisters and our brothers. During this week, may we recognize the presence of our Risen Savior in others; and as witnesses to Christ, let us make the Lord present to everyone that we meet.

"Peter said to the people: 'You denied the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you. The author of life you put to death, but God raised him from the dead, of this we are witnesses. Now I know, brothers, that you acted out of ignorance, just as your leaders did, but God has thus brought to fulfillment what he had announced beforehand through the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer. Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away.'"

The Acts of the Apostles, the story of the first Christians and early church has wonderful sermons, or teachings from St. Peter and Saint Paul. As people ask where I should begin to read the Bible, it is suggested that we look to those sermons to set the stage for our understanding.
