

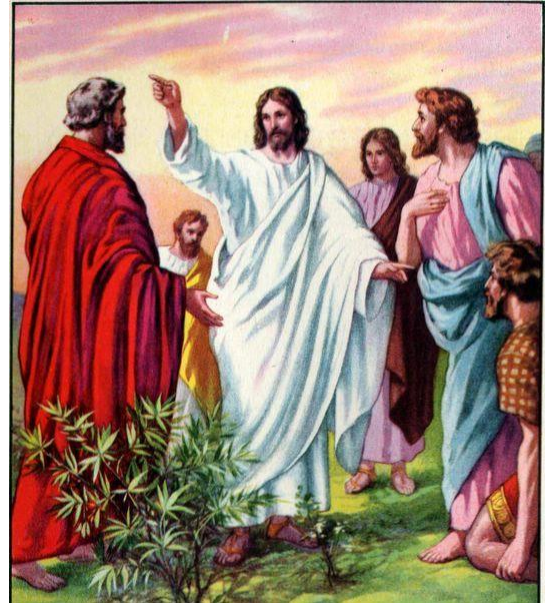

ON THE SUNDAY READINGS
HIS WORD TODAY**

**Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
July 14, 2024**

“Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits...’ Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them.’ So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.”

We can picture Jesus calling then sending His chosen ones to begin their mission. They listened to His instruction and then acted upon it, preaching, healing, continuing the work and mission of Jesus. They responded to His call and accepted their responsibility.

The Synod is similar to this scene. Delegates called to listening sessions, invoking the Holy Spirit, leading the church where the Lord wants us to go. Are we willing today to welcome this work of the Lord and listen to what the Spirit is calling us to do? The role of the prophet Amos or as Paul describes we who have been chosen ‘so that we might exist for the praise of his glory, we who have hoped in Christ.’

First Reading: Amos 7:12-15

Amaziah (priest of Bethel) ordered Amos to leave Bethel and never prophesy there again. Amos replied that he had not been a prophet, but was a shepherd until he was called by God.

Second Reading: Ephesians 1:3-14 or 1:3-10

Paul exults God’s immeasurable generosity as he recounts all the blessings that have been bestowed upon all God’s people. We all became adopted children of God when we heard the message of truth Christ brought to us, and because of it, believed in him.

Gospel: Mark 6:7-13

Jesus gave the twelve disciples authority over unclean spirits and sent them out to preach and heal the sick. He advised them to bring nothing with them and to shake the dust from their feet of any town where they had not been welcomed. Jesus wanted them to understand what they would need to do in his place after his death.

Sensory Friendly Mass: In an effort to embrace and welcome the members of our church with Autism, down syndrome and developmental disabilities, Our Lady of Hope will begin hosting once a month Sensory-Friendly Liturgies. These Masses include lower lights, softer music and shorter more literal homilies: however, the biggest difference is that we try to create an environment that is welcoming and nonjudgmental to all. We encourage families and individuals to get up and move if needed, to bring alternative seating, fidgets or noise canceling headphone and to participate in the liturgy just as they are. **The first Sensory Friendly Mass will be on July 14th at 2PM with fellowship to follow.**

DEACON'S CORNER

The feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel will be celebrated on Tuesday, July 16. This name is given to the Blessed Mother as the patroness of the Carmelite order. In the 13th century, Christian hermits settled on Mount Carmel in the Holy Land. They became known as the Carmelites. They constructed a chapel and dedicated it to the Blessed Mother.

According to the Carmelite tradition, the brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel was presented by Our Lady to St. Simon Stock who was the Father General of the Order in 1251. Our Lady gave St. Simon the following promise, "Receive, My beloved son, this habit of thy order: this shall be to thee and to all Carmelites a privilege, that whosoever dies clothed in this shall never suffer eternal fire. It shall be a sign of salvation, a protection in danger, and a pledge of peace."

Let us pray the prayer to Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. O most beautiful Flower of Mount Carmel, fruitful vine, splendor of Heaven, Blessed Mother of the Son of God, Immaculate Virgin, assist me in this my necessity. O Star of the Sea, help me and show me herein that you are my Mother. O Holy Mary, Mother of God, Queen of Heaven and earth, I humbly beseech you from the bottom of my heart, to succor me in this my necessity. There are none that can withstand your power. O show me herein that you are my Mother.
